M's Action Diary for June

- Remove spent flowers from roses by cutting back to the next leaf.
- Divide bearded irises after flowering
- Trim hedges and feed with a general fertilizer
- Cut euphorbias and oriental poppies down to ground level. Fresh leave with grow, and some poppies may flower again. Safety note: remember to wear gloves for euphorbia as the sap is an irritant to skin and eyes.
- Remove spent flowers from rhododendrons and azaleas
- Prune spring and early summer flowering shrubs such as deutzia forsythia and philadelphia
- Cut back perennial geraniums and aquilegias unless needed for seeding
- Continue keeping an eye open for vine weevils and lily beetles
- Birds till need feeding and being supplied with fresh water.

Green Gardening Tip

Encourage creatures that feed on greenfly and blackfly such as birds, insects and their larvae, earwigs and bats. Grow flowers that attract hoverflies, lacewings and ladybirds. Inspect plants regularly and pick off shoots and leaves infested by these pesky aphids and drop into a bucket of soapy water. A strong jet of water can also dislodge them or squish heavy infestations on fresh plant shoots with your fingers (wear rubber gloves if squeamish). Avoid sprays - as birds, wasps and other beneficial creatures are feeding their young. www.gardenorganic.org.uk/pests-and-diseases
