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Chorleywood Community Orchard

Alison Rubens

Alison was the founder and until recently, Chairman of the Chorleywood Community Orchard which was formed in 2008. They were fortunate in being given the land at Chorleywood House by Three Rivers Council. The orchard consisted of 140 trees which are sponsored by local people, mostly apple but some plum, cherry and damson. The trees were planted as 1 and 2 year saplings which had to be watered regularly for the first two years. The varieties they grow are Hertfordshire heritage apples known to have been

grown locally. In fact, the site appears as orchard on old maps. The trees are only sprayed against disease once a year.

They have a good number of volunteers for watering, weeding, tying and staking. They have a monthly Work Day with the tasks emailed ahead. The trees are planted at 8m distance because they grow those with a vigorous rootstock which is best for poor soil.

The Community Orchard is very much involved with School and Nursery Days, Apple Days, Pressed Apple Juice, Bug Hunts, Pruning Workshops, Preparation and Selling Jams, Jellies and Chutneys, a Christmas Festival and Wassailing. Even the local butcher is involved after being asked to make apple sausages! The

Apple Day seems like a local Festival with BBQ, Raffles, Cake Stall and Apple pressing. There is an off-shoot of a Cider Club with the cider on sale at local events. Pests, particularly squirrels are a problem. People can pick the fruit but this may cause difficulties with early picking or damage to trees.

The orchard is a great Community Asset being popular with dog-walkers and everyone who enjoys being out in the open air. **Jan Bradley**

Note from BW: Should you wish to visit the orchard, and I would recommend it, it is in the grounds of Chorleywood House Estate. The entrance drive is opposite Chorleywood Common on the A404 and the orchard is situated behind the lawn cemetery. Their website is very comprehensive. http://chorleywoodorchard.org.uk/

M's Action Diary for October

- Keep leaves free of fallen fruit and leaves.
- Cover bare soil with ½ inch of mulch such as garden compost or well-rotted manure
- Bring tender plants in pots under cover or wrap in fleece.
- Empty ceramic pots and bring under cover to prevent frost damage.
- Report cyclamen tubers when new leaves appear.
- Lift dahlia tubers after frost. Cut back stems and stand them upside down for a couple of weeks to dry before laying them in a tray of dry compost. Store somewhere cool and frost free.#Prune climbing and rambling roses. Trim long tems of standard roses to reduce wind-rock. Remove leaves showing signs of black spot.
- Order bear rooted roses, trees and hedging plants for winter planting.
- Plant bedding such as wallflowers, violas, bellis and Sweet Williams to flower in the Spring.
- Plant Spring bulbs in pots.

Green Gardening Tip

Not a gardening tip this month, but one that can help us to do our bit to prevent good food going to landfill. The Community Fridge is situated behind the Co-op, its stocked and run by volunteers. It is NOT a food bank, it is for everyone in the community. The food is donated by local shops when it is approaching or past its "sell by" date but still within its "use by" date, which would usually go to landfill or excess produce from local growers.
